## **Director's Note**

## by Kate Hennig

Opening one's heart can be difficult, especially in this day and age. There are so many reasons to keep tight, to keep closed, to keep safe inside a construction of fear and cynicism. How do we challenge ourselves to think and be in a more simple way; a more heartfelt way; to look for the blue skies, to go for an old-fashioned walk, or to enjoy a happy holiday? These seem like guilty pleasures in a world plagued by justifiable anxiety.

Let *Holiday Inn* be a respite. At this seasonal time of year when the darkness is at its most dark, and the light, which will inevitably grow, is still hiding just around the corner, *Holiday Inn* offers no threat, no nastiness, no danger. This piece (originally the film) was an antidote to the Second World War: it provided reassurance for a society trying to rediscover ease and comfort in a world that was suffering so much loss – so much collective pain – and was crippled by the fear of an unknowable future. Sound familiar?

*Holiday Inn* is peopled with "chosen family"; the community one surrounds oneself with to provide healing, help and hope. We send you this postcard from 1946; we open our hearts wide, we rely on each other, we collaborate, listen, agree to disagree, and through the strength of our collective spirit we bring you this play filled with LOVE; where the worst thing that happens is misunderstanding; where we seek, and manage, to solve that misunderstanding. We lead you on a simple path of joy and pleasure. And it is our wish that with grace and good fortune you might share that joy and pleasure with your loved ones this holiday season.

## **Production History**

Based on the Paramount Pictures 1942 movie of the same name (starring Bing Crosby and Fred Astaire, with music by Irving Berlin), a stage version of *Holiday Inn*, with book by Gordon Greenberg and Chad Hodge, opened at the Goodspeed Opera House in East Haddam, Connecticut, on September 19, 2014, directed by Greenberg A second production ran at the Muny (outdoor)opera house in St Louis in July 2015, and the Broadway premiere, in a Roundabout Theatre production (still directed by Greenberg) opened at Studio 54 on October 6, 2016, where it ran (including previews) for 117 performances. It won Tony and Drama Desk nominations for choreographer Denis Jones. The Canadian premiere of *Holiday Inn*, directed by Michael Lichtefeld, opened at the Drayton, Ontario, Festival Theatre on May 16, 2018. (And, yes, it was the movie that inspired the naming of a well-known hotel chain.)

This is a remount of the Shaw Festival's original 2019 production.
